Joe's lifelong basketball addiction started at High School where he played for the Fisher Park Warriors. Joe was featured in their 1977-1978 Year Book for being named (along with team mate Richard Zmich) Most Valuable Player for the entire Halifax Invitational tournament. Joe (#33) was key to the Fisher Park Warriors locking up a solid victory in the Halifax that year in a team that was described as "the strongest Boys' Basketball Team that Fisher has had in many years.
